The legal framework for trade unions in generally employee health and safety




The conducted by our trade union on education staff survey on effects coronavirus on people's health



Social labour inspection

- notify the headteacher and school leaders about any violations of occupational health and safety regulations or labour law provisions,
- demand immediate removal of direct threats to the life and health school employees,
- take part in analysing the impact of spreading coronavirus on the school society,
- monitor the application of decisions and recommendations made by bodies responsible for controlling and counteracting the epidemics in the school. Notify these bodies if their decisions are not completed,
- suggest and give approval to projects which aim is improving working conditions in terms of epidemic.








Long Covid-19 syndrome


Symptoms and the course of disease of COVID-19 have changed since 2019. Fortunately, they have became weaker and most people have recovered within a few weeks.

However, no matter how serious the course was several common symptoms of post COVID-19 syndrome have been still reported.












Analysis conclusions
